What is the Law Enforcement Torch Run?

Each year, law enforcement officers from across the state raise funds and awareness for Special Olympics Virginia through the Law Enforcement Torch Run for Special Olympics. Since 1987, when the Virginia Law Enforcement Torch Run began, it has grown consistently every year. In 2017, law enforcement officials raised more than \$1.3 million! Through the efforts of you and thousands of other officers, deputies and Department of Corrections and Regional Jail officials, the Virginia Law Enforcement Torch Run has contributed more than \$19 million to Special Olympics athletes in Virginia since its inception.

How it Works

The Torch Run (LETR) in Virginia involves more than 2,000 law enforcement officers from over 300 agencies who take part in a 1900+ mile, 8-day torch relay to pass the Special Olympics "Flame of Hope" across Virginia. All of the relays converge in Richmond in June for the lighting of the cauldron during the Special Olympics Virginia Summer Games Opening Ceremony.

The History

The Law Enforcement Torch Run for Special Olympics, the largest grassroots fundraising program benefiting Special Olympics, began in 1981 when Wichita, Kansas Police Chief Richard LaMunyon saw an urgent need to raise funds for and increase awareness of Special Olympics. The idea for the Torch Run was to provide local law enforcement officers with an opportunity to volunteer with Special Olympics in the communities where the officers lived and worked. After three years of successful runs in Kansas, Chief LaMunyon presented his idea to the International Association of Chiefs of Police, which endorsed Special Olympics as its official charity through the Torch Run. Today, all 50 states and more than 40 countries have their own versions of the Torch Run. In Virginia, the first Torch Run was organized in 1986 when relays were run from Northern Virginia, Harrisonburg, and Tidewater to Richmond to the University of Richmond, site of the Special Olympics Virginia Summer Games. Today, the Torch Run has grown into the most important fundraising effort of Special Olympics Virginia. Since its inception, the Torch Run has continued to reach new records in fundraising efforts every year. Currently, the VA Torch Run is recognized as one of the top 16 fundraising Torch Run Programs in the World. Along with being the premier fundraising event for Special Olympics Virginia, it is also the most visible event in Special Olympics.

The Virginia Law Enforcement Torch Run is presented by the SunTrust Foundation, Enterprise, Hardee's and the Wawa Foundation and is organized by the Virginia Association of Chiefs of Police, the Virginia Sheriff's Association, the Virginia Department of Corrections, the Virginia Association of Regional Jails and the Virginia Association of Campus Law Enforcement Administrators.
